SCHAUMBURG, IL (March 19, 2010) — In response to the need for emergency aid following the 8.8 magnitude earthquake that struck on February 27 resulting in over 700 people killed, 2 million people displaced, and an estimated 500,000 homes damaged, the Omron Foundation, Inc. (Schaumburg, IL) has donated \$10,000 to the American Red Cross--Chile Relief and Development effort. This is in addition to Omron Corporation's (Kyoto, Japan; www.omron.com) donation of 2 million yen (about \$22,000) to "The Japan Platform", a system to provide quick and effective emergency relief in natural disasters and refugee situations. Rescue operations continue in Chile as survivors struggle to meet the most basic needs in the aftermath of the earthquake and subsequent aftershocks.
